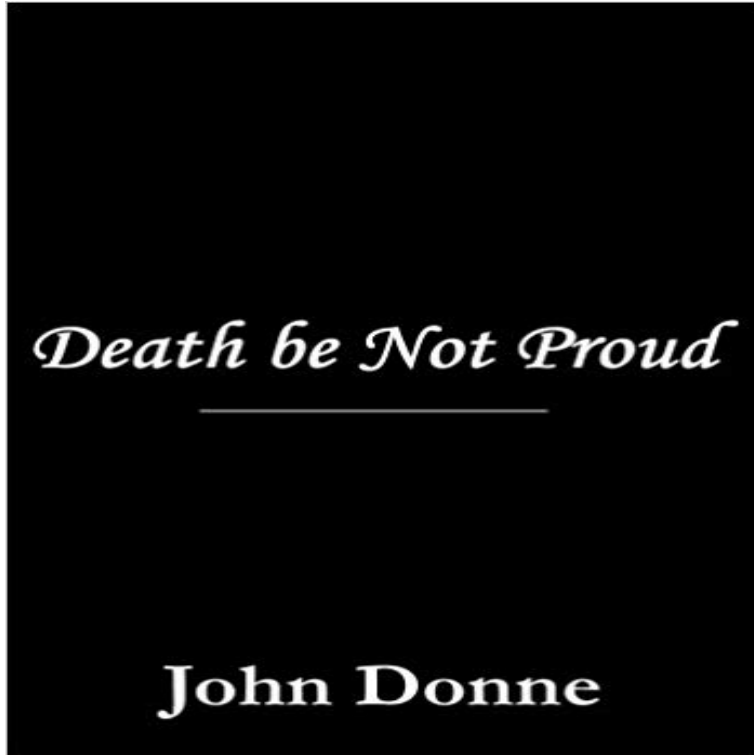


Death be Not Proud
