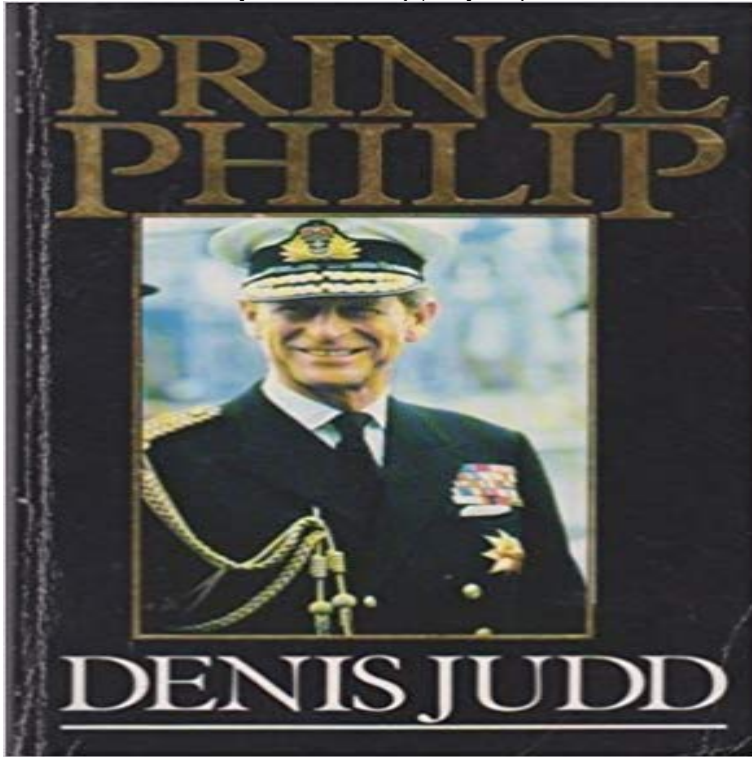


Prince Philip: A Biography
