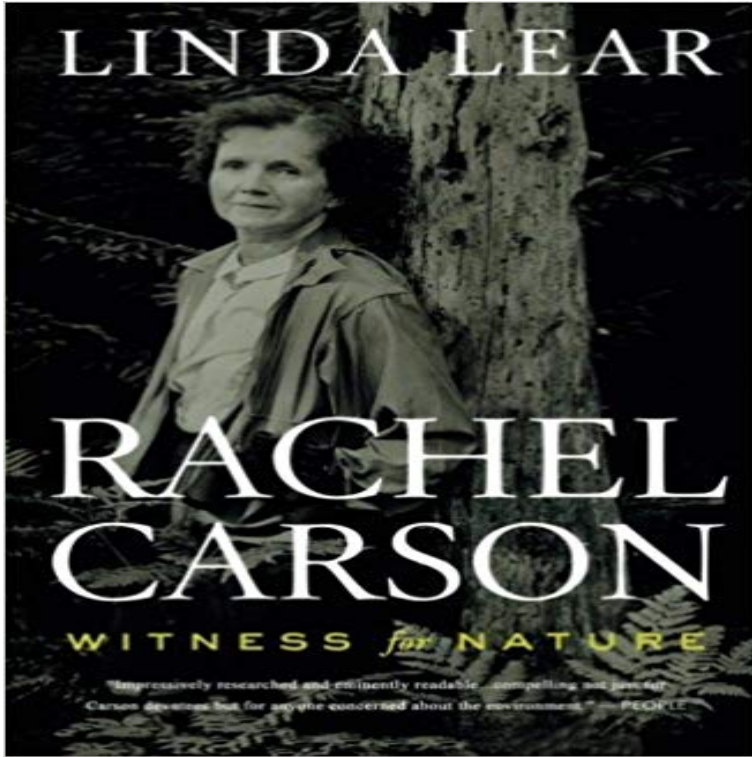


## Rachel Carson: Witness for Nature
