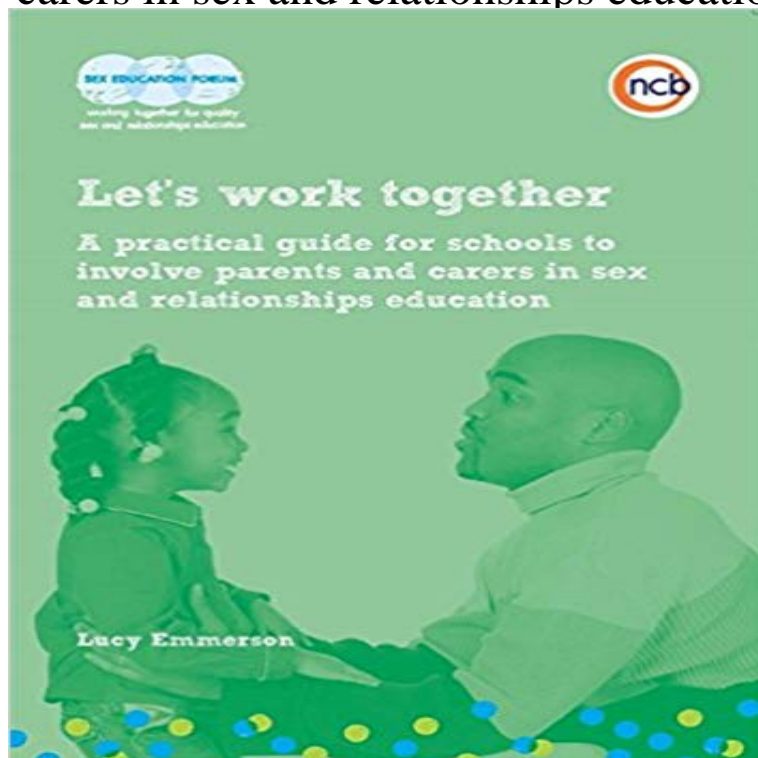


Lets work together: A practical guide for schools to involve parents and carers in sex and relationships education
